North Penn the district swim favorite

stands out a little bit more than the rest. This year that person is Dan Dingman, who won league titles in the 200 IM and 100 free, and should be up on the medal stand this weekend.

His versatility allows coach Brian Daly to plug him in wherever he is needed, a big key to getting points out of every event.

Dingman will also be big on the relays, which all have a shot of taking gold.

Where there is Dingman, Nico Gimenez is usually not far behind, and Gimenez is coming off strong performances in the 100 breast and the IM at leagues.

The Knights are strong in the 500 free, led by Brandon Ward. Further versatility is provided by Ryan Coupe, who swam on two gold-medal-winning relays at leagues.

If the Knights are to continue their epic streak, they will have to once again hold off a strong Souderton Area team.

The Indians have state hopefuls in Tim Dorsch, Jake Radcliff, Sean Corcoran and Joe Reynolds.

Dorsch is one of the high seeds in the 100 breast, and Radcliff is a top freestyler, expected to go in the 200 and 500.

The Big Red have another top breaststroker in Sean Corcoran, and Joe Reynolds has had a good season in the 50 free.

Methacton, Penndridge, Wissahickon and CB West will also have representatives in the AAA competition, with Lansdale Catholic sending some swimmers in Class AA.

Somerville Avenue. Make a left onto Somerville to Ogontz Avenue. Take a right on Ogontz to second light (Olney Avenue). Make a left on Olney to first light (20th Street). Go straight through the light. At the next light, make a left into the parking lot. At the security booth, make a left and the security personnel will direct you to the designated visitor parking spaces. Enter campus.
