BUCKINGHAM — Three pool records came tumbling down Thursday when North Penn swept a Suburban One League Continental Conference double dual swimming meet from host Central Bucks East.

The Maidens' Aimee Baur, Olivia DiStefano, Erin O'Neill and Kailyn Evans closed out a 105-76 win by shattering the 400-yard freestyle relay time of 3:39.76 set by an East foursome in 2004.

"When we saw (the record), we told ourselves we had to beat it because we were really close to that time in our last few meets," said Evans, the anchor who capped the 3:35.77 effort. "We were doing 3:40 or 3:41, but going 3:35 this early in the season? I'm just so proud of all the airls.

The other two records were set as the Knights wrapped up a 97-84 victory. Thanas Kountroubis, Mike Kern, Liam Kelly and anchor Brett Else combined to win the 200 free relay in 1:28.87, topping the standard East set in 2010.

With Else swimming leadoff, the same four won the 400 free relay in 3:13.66, nearly four full seconds better than the mark a Hatboro-Horsham quartet established in

"The four of us are really close, so setting records together is what we were talking about before the 200. It's the first of many to come, hopefully," Else said, "On the 400. I hoped I could get out in front and then stay there. I did that and then left it up to the next three guys.

"Given my choice, I'd rather swim anchor because it's really exciting to bring it home, touch that wall and hear everyone cheering.


After Hannah Wittman easily beat Evans in the girls IM, sophomore Erin Lengel, who later finished second to DiStefano in the 100 free, made it two in a row for the Patriots, pulling away on the return leg to win with a 25.62 in the 50 free.

"I've always preferred shorter distances because I like going fast," Lengel said. "It challenges you to keep up your endurance, but it's also hard to work for it (in practice).

"There are so many outstanding (sprinters) who have come through this program, and it's (a challenge) to follow in their footsteps.
